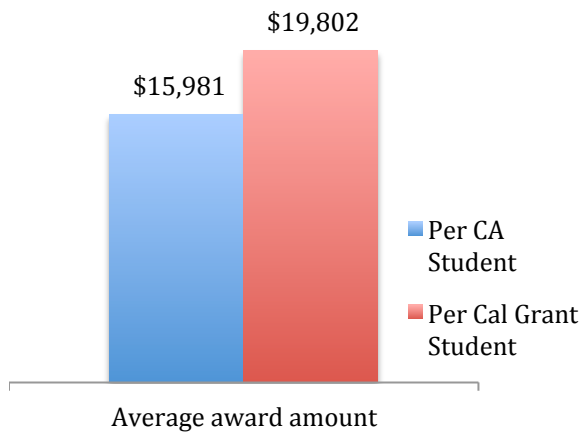


A Public-Private Partnership at Work

The private, nonprofit sector annually educates over 28,000 California students through the Cal Grant program.

AICCU institutions are dedicated to student access, with 79% of students receiving institutional grants – money that does not need to be paid back.

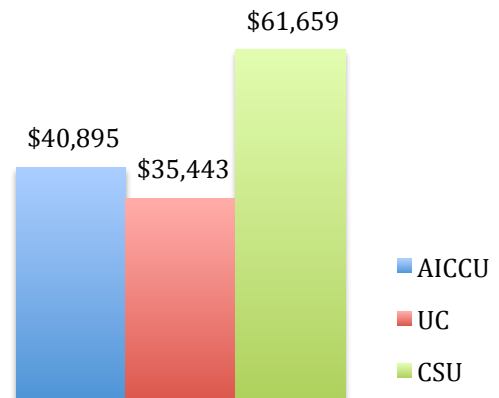
**Institutional Grant Award

The Cal Grant award for students attending a private, nonprofit institution has been vulnerable to cuts over the past decade. The value of the maximum award, \$9,086, has decreased by about 38% since 2000 (adjusted for inflation).

The average family income of Cal Grant A students attending a private, nonprofit institution is lower than that of a student at a CSU institution.

With 39% who are first generation students, and 68% students of color, Cal Grants to AICCU students help provide higher education access to California’s diverse population.

At a total 4-year cost to the State of approximately \$35K for one AICCU Cal Grant student (\$102K for UC and \$53K for CSU including Cal Grant and State Subsidy), AICCU Cal Grant students offer a strong ROI, strengthening California’s economic future.
