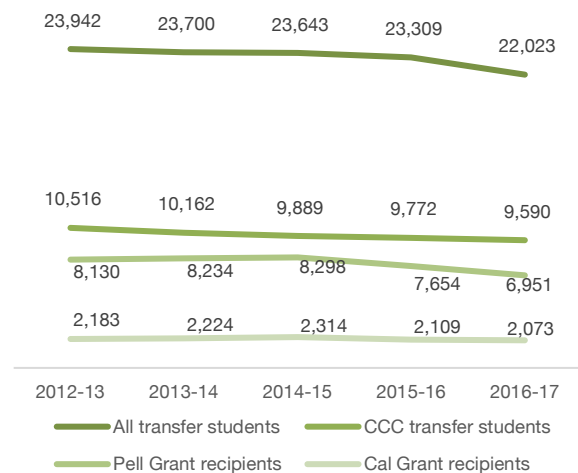




## Keeping the Promise to Transfer Students

Since 2012-13, AICCU institutions increased undergraduate enrollment. However, institutions experienced a decrease in new transfer students (including, but not limited to, transfers from other four-year, in-state and out-of-state institutions, and out-of-state two-year colleges) from 23,942 in 2012-13 to 22,023 in 2016-17—a decrease of 8%. For new California Community College (CCC) transfer students, the enrollment trend has mirrored the overall transfer rates, witnessing a decrease from 10,516 in 2012-13 to 9,590 in 2016-17—a 8.8% drop.

Although there has been a decrease in the number of new transfer students, since 2012-13, AICCU institutions have a strong commitment to transfer students.

On Wednesday, July 25, 2018, AICCU President Kristen Soares and California Community Colleges' Chancellor Eloy Ortiz Oakley signed a Memorandum of Understanding that creates a pathway for community college transfer students graduating with an [Associate Degree for Transfer \(ADT\)](#), to transfer to an AICCU participating institution. Currently, 36 AICCU institutions will be participating in the [AICCU ADT commitment](#).
